Mother and child Health clinic was Inaugurated in the gracious presence of Panvel Municipal Corporation Member Mr. Manohar Mhatre and Dr. Deepak Raut, Director NIPHTR on 11th October 2021. This clinic has been started in collaboration with Shri Satya Sai Sanjivani Centre, Kharghar.

On this occasion, Shri Manohar Mhatre, expressed his gratitude for starting this clinic as it will be the first of its kind which can provide free check ups to the pregnant women in the neighbouring Villages.



Dr. Deepak Raut in his address mentioned that there is a rapid development of Panvel city and surrounding premises. It is important that pregnant women get health facilities close to their homes and NIPHTR clinic will definitely serve this purpose.

The clinic is well equipped and has a full time Medical officer & team for patient care. In addition a Gynaecologist from the Satya Sai Sanjeevani will visit the clinic every Monday for ANC check ups. This clinic will provide free blood-urine tests, calcium, iron, folic acid pills and vaccination of women during pregnancy. Counselling will also be given on family planning, contraception & Nutrition to the women.
